LGA Bulletin Updates

DLUHC Updates

On 2 February 2022, the Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities (DLUHC) published the Levelling Up White Paper. The paper includes the **Government's intention to ask LGPS pension funds, to publish plans for increasing local investment**, including setting an ambition of up to 5% of assets invested in projects which support UK projects.

Highlights from HMRC Newsletter 137

The newsletter included a request that we remind pension scheme members to tell HMRC in writing as soon as possible if they have lost their LTA protection.

Consultation on reporting deadlines

<u>Pays.</u> The (Draft) Registered Pension Schemes (Miscellaneous Amendments) Regulations 2022 are in addition to the changes introduced by the Finance Act 2022.

The changes will apply to members of all UK pension schemes. It will be of particular relevance when dealing with members whose pension input amount for a past year is changed as a result of the McCloud remedy.

The Government proposes that the regulations take effect from 6 April 2022. The short consultation will close on 15 March 2022.

Finance Act 2022 receives Royal Assent

Annual allowance deadlines: Deadlines for electing for scheme pays & associated payment & reporting deadlines will be extended for certain members who are informed of a change in pension input amount for a past pension input period.

Normal minimum pension age: The NPA will increase from 55 to 57 from 6 April 2028, but we do not know yet whether the LGPS Regulations will change to include a protected pension age.

Power to change tax rules related to the McCloud remedy: The Act provides HM Treasury with the power to make regulations to address tax impacts that arise as a result of implementing the McCloud remedy.

The Dakota Dashboard






Helpful Tips & Shortcuts

Single-use spreadsheets on Sharepoint



A reminder of the workaround regarding single-use spreadsheets on Sharepoint.

First, choose the spreadsheet you wish to check out by finding the 3 dots to the right of the name of the spreadsheet.



Then scroll down to the bottom of the list and choose more, you will then see the Check Out option. Please click here, once the spreadsheet is checked out, you may continue as normal, enable content etc...



This is a separate issue to the "upload failed" error that you may have experienced and you'll have to "clear the cache" within the options section (file>options>save>Cache settings>delete cache).




Helpful Tips & Shortcuts
