	"Regarding, the amount of weeds in the gutters and on pavements in Surrey, why is the Council not clearing weeds from the gutters and pavements? This important and basic service is not provided regularly, and plants are now taking over our pavements and gutters and making the area extremely scruffy and uncared for?"
	Answered by Richard Bolton, Assistant Director - Highways Operations & Infrastructure
	It is accepted that weeds can be an issue to our residents and damage the highway infrastructure. The Council does treat weeds and this year, in addition to the one treatment with a herbicide, teams have also been deployed to remove or strim weeds in identified key locations. For 2025, the intention is to undertake an early season weed treatment (around March to April, to be confirmed) across the entire county which should help improve weed management. We will continue to review if further treatments, or other action, are needed.
	Street cleansing is the responsibility of the local District or Borough Council. In some areas service levels have reduced in recent years, which has exasperated issues with weeds by enabling them to become more embedded in the channels of some roads.
