We also discussed how to support members to increase their awareness of mental health issues that residents may be facing and Chris is going to speak to Public Health to see if we can extend the Mental Health First Aid Training staff offer to include members. As soon as we have more information on what this offer could look like, I can pass it onto you to share with Sinead and the rest of the committee."

A further update was received from Sarah Quinn, Member Services Manager, in October 2021:

"Mental Health Awareness training will be offered to all Members in early 2022. Two virtual sessions will be offered and a recording will be made for the Member Portal for anyone unable to attend "live". The training will introduce the concept of Mental Health First Aiders with a view to offering further training to any Members who are interested in taking on this specific role.
